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Where to go for Easter brunch in and around Los Angeles

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If you're planning on having Easter brunch out this year (no one will blame you), here's a guide to restaurants offering brunch, and even a few Easter egg hunts, in and around the L.A. area. Because even if your family's tradition includes roast leg of lamb, crab eggs Benedict and bottomless mimosas, there's a restaurant that will prepare those things for you. And this way, after all those chocolate eggs and omelets, you can head home to make a Peeps diorama, and let someone else do the dishes.

Terranea Resort will have three different brunch options, including a ballroom brunch, a brunch at Mar'sel and a brunch at Catalina Kitchen. The **ballroom brunch** will include a buffet with pastries, an omelet station, pasta and risotto stations, a carving board and more. Seatings between 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. The buffet is priced at \$95 for adults and \$47 for children age four to 10. Tickets must be purchased in advance. **Mar'sel** will have a four-course bottomless mimosa brunch for \$85 per person. And **Catalina Kitchen** will have a buffet with a view of the ocean priced at \$80 for adults and \$35 for children age five to 12. Children 4 and younger are served complimentary.
