One person is jumping off a yacht into the [crystal-clear waters of Greece](#), another has taken a tide-fall selfie at [McWay Falls in Big Sur](#). FOMO hits. But the thought of going through the motions required to book a vacation are unfathomable: looking up flights, searching for a place to stay in parts unknown, devising an itinerary. Why not take a staycation—with five-star amenities? Here, seven hotels that will prove that staying local has never been more appealing.

Terranea

If you live in: Los Angeles (about 45 minutes away)

What to do: The 102-acre, peninsula-set Terranea offers a spa that spans 50,000 square feet, offering treatment rooms with panoramic views of the Pacific Ocean, peaceful sauna rooms, and an oceanfront yoga and pilates studio. If you decide to forgo the spa pool, lounge around at the adult-only Cielo Point with a drink in hand. And for the active type, golfing, paddleboarding, kayorkling (yes, that would be kayaking and snorkling combined), horseback riding, helicopter tours of the peninsula, and even falconry are all options. For nourishment, there are eight dining establishments to choose from, but don't pass on Mar'sel, the waterfront farm-to-table restaurant that uses locally grown produce and herbs gathered from a garden just steps away from the kitchen.

The splurge: While even the standard rooms offer a private patio or balcony, go with the residential-style, oceanfront Bungalow, unwind by either the indoor or outdoor fireplace, and enjoy the benefits of complimentary entry to the spa pool and its facilities, breakfast and lunch at the café, and discounts on spa treatments.

Rates: Rooms start from \$395 per night; Bungalows start from \$1,100 per night
